Thoughts from Pastor Dan

In the Men's Bible Study we have been studying the book of Ephesians. This past week we arrived at Ephesians 3. I was struck by the power in Paul's words at the end of the chapter. Paul ends his prayer for the Ephesians by saying, "Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, for ever and ever! Amen."

What an amazing privilege it is for us to be able to be in relationship with such a God.

Max Lucado tells the story of an incident that occurred several years ago during the New Year's Day Tournament of Roses parade. During the parade one of the beautiful floats suddenly sputtered and quit. It

was out of gas. Since the immobile float was blocking the road, the whole parade was held up until someone could get a can of gas to refill the tank. The amusing thing was this float was sponsored by the Standard Oil Company. Despite Standard Oil's vast oil resources, its float was the one that ran out of gas.

Christians have a vast spiritual resource in the power of God within us. Too often though we do not take advantage of this resource and instead find ourselves stalled on our journey through life.

This past Sunday I shared some words from Thomas Kelly which emphasize that our power to propel through life is not of ourselves but the work of an all-powerful God. Kelly said, "the energizing, dynamic center is not in us but in the

Divine Presence in which we share. Religion is not *our* concern; it is God's concern. The sooner we stop thinking *we* are the energetic operators of religion and discover that God is at work, as the Aggressor, the Invader, the Initiator, so much sooner do we discover that our task is to call people to be still and know, listen, hearken in quiet invitation to the subtle promptings of the Divine . . . Too many well-intentioned people are so preoccupied with the clatter of effort to do something *for* God that they don't hear God asking that God might do something *through* them."

God desires "to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine." May we open our hearts and wills to the overwhelming power of God this month so that we may transform and be transformed.

We had worshipped elsewhere in the area but were looking for a smaller evangelical church. We found River-


side to be very welcoming.
