



How to use Pod Talk:

Talking through the Bible during the week helps us practice what we are learning. Read the Sunday Bible passage, discuss what you notice, share what God is inviting you to apply to your life, and wrap up with prayer. (SOAP)

Sermon Main Idea:

The Lord relates with real people, in real circumstances, in real time and wants us to relate with Him.

Introduction:

1. When has the Lord asked you to do something you felt was over your head?
2. How do you respond to the statement, “Doing God’s work is costly?”

SOAP:

Scripture | read Jeremiah 1:4-10;7:1-11 and relate last week’s daily bible readings

Observation | what do we notice? what stands out?

1. What is the setting of Jeremiah 1? (1:1-4)
2. What is God’s word to Jeremiah? (1:4-5)
3. How did Jeremiah respond? Why does he question God? (1:6)
4. What assurance does the Lord give to Jeremiah? (1:7-10)
5. Summarize some of the Lord’s concerns with Judah. (7:1-11)
6. How does the Lord ask Judah to change? (7:3-7)

Application | what can we apply to our life today?

1. What mundane or difficult thing is the Lord asking you to do for Him that you may be resisting?
2. In what ways does earthly comfort and success keep you from being more faithful to the Lord?
3. What will help you know, love and serve the Lord this week, and know that you are His beloved child?
4. Do you doubt that the Lord can and will use you to serve Him? Why or Why not?
5. In what ways can you take advantage of how the Lord Jesus bring God’s word to us today?
6. This week how can you keep going further Up, in your relationship with God? In, in your relationship with those in the church? Or, Out, in your relationship with those outside the church?

Prayer | ask God to help you live out your application
