



How to use Pod Talk:

Talking through the Bible during the week helps us practice what we are learning. Read the Sunday Bible passage, discuss what you notice, share what God is inviting you to apply to your life, and wrap up with prayer. (SOAP)

Sermon Main Idea:

Jesus is forming a Kingdom Community to share in His Kingdom Work with His Unlimited Kingdom Power.

Introduction:

1. When have you experienced a miraculous “God moment” that left you in awe?
2. Do you believe that followers of Jesus can do the same things Jesus did? Why or why not?

SOAP:

Scripture | read Matthew 14:13-33 and relate last week’s daily bible readings

Observation | what do we notice? what stands out?

1. Where is Jesus and who is He with? Why? (vs. 13-14)
2. What do the disciples suggest and what does Jesus do instead? (vs. 15-21)
3. How many people were fed? How much food did they begin with? (vs. 7-12)
4. What did Jesus do after the meal? (vs. 22-24)
5. How does Jesus get to the disciples on the lake and how do they react? What does Peter do? (vs. 25-31)
6. What happens when Jesus and Peter get into the boat? How did the other disciples respond? (vs. 32-33)

Application | what can we apply to our life today?

1. What do we learn about Jesus from these stories? What do we learn about human nature?
2. How were the disciples able to feed the crowd?
3. How was Peter able to walk on the water like Jesus? Why did He sink?
4. Why does Jesus share His ministry and His power with His disciples? What does that mean for us?
5. How can you go further in believing that Jesus has shared His Kingdom power with you? (Jn. 14:12; Eph. 1:18-21)
6. What is one way Jesus is inviting you to trust Him and live beyond your resources and abilities?
7. How can you respond to this passage in your relationship with God (Up)? In your relationship with those in the church (In)? Or, in your relationship with those outside the church (Out)?

Prayer | ask God to help you live out your application
