



Sermon Main Idea:

The Living Water of Jesus Christ is the sole source of true satisfaction and is available to all.

Introduction:

1. What are some examples of “feuding” people groups in our culture today?
2. How has the “feud” played out in the interactions of the people in these groups?

SORP:

Scripture | read John 4:1-30 and relate last week’s daily bible readings

Observation | what do we notice? what stands out?

1. When Jesus stopped to rest at the well, he was tired and thirsty...part of the human experience. What other human thoughts/feelings/experiences do you think Jesus had, as He conversed with the Samaritan woman?
2. How might the woman at the well have felt when Jesus engaged her in conversation?
3. What stands out to you about the conversation between Jesus and the Samaritan woman?
4. When the disciples were surprised to find Jesus talking with the Samaritan woman, why do you think they didn’t question Him?
5. Read John 4:39-42. What strikes you about the impact that the testimony of the Samaritan woman had on the town?

Response | how can we respond in our lives to what we learn?

1. What are people groups that Christians today struggle to consider worthy of the Living Water? How can we shift our judgmentalism into the kind of grace Jesus shows the Samaritan woman?
2. The Living Water is the sole source of *true* satisfaction. What are some sources of pseudo-satisfaction in your life? What are you attempting to satisfy your soul with?
3. In order to receive the Living Water, we need to release our sources of pseudo-satisfaction. How is God calling you to let go of that which brings only temporary satisfaction? Removing it from your life? Reducing the amount of time you spend focusing on it? Restructuring its priority in your life?
4. How else might God be calling you to respond to this passage?

Prayer | ask God to help you live out your response
