

## Thoughts From Pastor Dan

### What is time?

A few weeks ago when I was in Chicago for our conference's annual meeting I spent some time talking with a friend of mine who is a pastor in Chicago. Her congregation has been sharing their facility with a Hispanic congregation and recently began conducting events to blend the two congregations together. She said that the experience has been wonderful for both congregations, but that it has revealed some interesting cultural differences. One such difference revolves around time. The Hispanic congregation has a very different understanding of time than my friend's primarily Anglo congregation. For instance, the Hispanic congregation is less concerned with preciseness with respect to time. If they schedule an event at 2pm in the afternoon that simply means that the event will start somewhere near 2pm. Anglos generally understand such organizing times as the exact time the event is to begin. There is a fundamental difference in how time is understood in different cultures.

A professor I had in seminary used to say it this way: is time something you fill up or is time something you experience? Often in our Western culture we value precision and efficiency above all other values. We thus focus in on days, minutes, hours and even seconds. We speak of making efficient use of our time

and by that we often mean that we need to adequately fill the open spaces on our calendar with stuff. This is not necessarily bad. In many ways it has contributed to our nation's economic successes and general societal progress. An overemphasis on the consumption of time, though, is contrary to the biblical understanding of time.

The words "minute" and "second" are not found anywhere in the Bible. Neither are the words "calendar" nor the word "clock" used in the Bible. The very idea of measuring time with precision was foreign to the ancient oriental mind. We often find in the Bible that exactness was not particularly important in dating events at all. In the Bible an hour might refer to an instant, to 45 minutes, an hour, an hour and a quarter, a period of three hours, a day, or even a season.

Biblical time is much more focused on seasons and rhythms. For instance, the days of the week were not named like our Sunday, Monday, etc., but were numbered except for the seventh day, which was known as the Sabbath. This facilitated a weekly progression towards the climactic Sabbath day. There were not individual disconnected days, but each week was a movement towards the next Sabbath. Their days functioned this way too. Each day was a movement from light to dark and from dark to

light, as opposed to hour to hour or minute to minute as measured by a clock.

How do you treat time? Is it yours to be consumed? Is it a gift to be relished? Does your detailed and scheduled life leave room to experience time? Does your planning leave room for the Holy Spirit to turn a 5 minute conversation into a 45 time of sharing with a friend? Is play, leisure, rest, or stopping to smell



the flowers a waste of time to you? Do you take pride in working a lot? Do you make yourself busy with doing unimportant things in order to avoid the hard work of doing the important things? Do you schedule God into your time or do you schedule your life into God's time?

Time does not rush. Time does not speed up. An hour is always 60 minutes. A day is always 24 hours. How will you experience your next hour? Your next day? Your life?

**Week 7:** What is witnessing and evangelism and how do I do it?

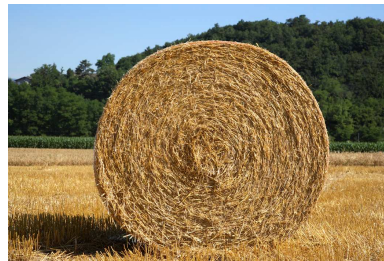
